1. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, who recognized the presence of State Senator Richard Richards, and welcomed his participation in the deliberations of the Commission.
2. UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION HELD IN LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA, ON FEBRUARY 11, 1958, WERE APPROVED AS WRITTEN AND MAILED TO THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION.

The Executive Officer reported that the date for the next meeting of the Commission was indefinite, inasmuch as the recommendations to be presented at that time on oil and gas leasing policies and procedure, based on the recommendations made by the special consultants, by representatives of the oil and gas industry, and on the hearings held in Sacramento on February 26 and 27, will be reviewed by the office of the Attorney General as to legal sufficiency and compliance with the statutes. As soon as possible after the report from the office of the Attorney General is received, final recommendations to the Commission will be drawn up, and arrangements will be made for the next meeting.
