## MINUTE ITEM

23. REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF EXPANDITURE OF TIDELAND OIL REVENUES BY THE CITY OF LONG BEACH FOR DREDGING ALAMITOS BAY - L.B.W.O. 10,110.

In presenting Calendar Item 40 attached, the Executive Officer stated that the record should show that under date of February 16, 1960, a letter was received by the Executive Secretary to the Chairman of the Commission from Spencer A. Hillman of 249 Venetia Drive, Long Beach, a copy of which letter is in the Commission's files. This letter reviews in three pages the majority of the history of the Alamitos Bay area and the projects which have heretofore been undertaken by the City of Long Beach, and summarizes an objection to and a suggestion relating to the subject project in the following words: "Now to get back to the dredging of the Upper Bay...Mr. Vickers notes sand bars are building up and are a danger to the many boats he expects to be in the bay....WHY NOT BAR ALL BOATS IN THE UPPER BAY AND NOT DREDGE IT?"

Mr. Jess D. Gilkerson, City Engineer of Long Beach, upon being asked for his comments on this letter, stated that he was startled to learn that there was an objection to the work being contemplated; that the City believed it had a well balanced, well conceived program for small craft facilities; that many of the boat owners live outside the boundaries of Long Beach; and that he couldn't accept the suggestion presented because of its impracticability.

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED:

THE COMMISSION APPROVES THE COSTS PROPOSED TO BE EXPENDED BY THE CITY OF LONG BEACH FROM ITS SHARE OF TIDELAND OIL REVENUES FOR THE DREDGING OF A PORTION OF ALAMITOS BAY, L.B.W.O. 10,110 AS INDICATED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND HEREBY MADE A PART HEREOF, BETWEEN FEBRUARY 25, 1960 AND JUNE 30, 1960 IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$150,000, SUBJECT TO THE CONDITION, HOWEVER, THAT THE WORK CONFORM IN ESSENTIAL DETAILS TO THE PLANS AND BACKGROUND MATERIAL HERETOFORE SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSION; AND THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER, THE ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER, OR THE SUPERVISING MINERAL RESOURCES ENGINEER ARE AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE APPROPRIATE WRITTEN INSTRUMENTS REFIECTING THE COMMISSION'S CONDITIONAL APPROVAL.

REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF EXPENDITURE OF TIDELAND OIL REVENUES BY THE CITY OF LONG BEACH FOR DREDGING ALAMITOS BAY - L.B.W.O. 10,110.

The City of Long Beach has requested the State Lands Commission to approve the expenditure of \$150,000 from the City's share of the tidelands oil revenue for the dredging of tidelands in Alamitos Bay from Second Street up to Appian Way. Approximately 100,000 cubic yards of silt will be removed to create a section with its base dimension varying between 98 and 137 feet dredged to a depth of 15 feet below mean lower low water. The dredge section will be approximately 3,100 feet long entering into Marine Stadium on the north. Approximately 25,000 cubic yards of the material is proposed to be placed on City property and adjoining private property south of the Marine Stadium between the Davi's Bridge and the dredge work. The remainder of the material is proposed to be placed on City property and adjoining private property north of the Marine Stadium westerly of the Davies Bridge.

The project has been reviewed by the staff and is considered to fall within the provisions of the trust with respect to the promotion of fisheries, commerce and navigation.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION APPROVE THE COSTS PROPOSED TO BE EXPENDED BY THE CITY OF LONG BEACH FROM ITS SHARE OF TIDELAND OIL REVENUES FOR THE DREDGING OF A PORTION OF ALAMITOS BAY, L.B.W.O. 10,110 AS INDICATED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND HEREBY MADE A PART HEREOF, BETWEEN FEBRUARY 25, 1960 AND JUNE 30, 1960 IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$150,000, SUBJECT TO THE CONDITION, HOWEVER, THAT THE WORK CONFORM IN ESSENTIAL DETAILS TO THE PLANS AND BACKGROUND MATERIAL HERETOFORE SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSION; AND THAT THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER, 'THE ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE OFFICER, OR THE SUPERVISING MINERAL RESOURCES ENGINEER BE AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE APPROPRIATE WRITTEN INSTRUMENTS REFLECTING THE COMMISSION'S CONDITIONAL APPROVAL.
