## CALENDAR ITEM

PROPOSED OIL AND GAS LEASE, TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS, SANTA BARBARA COUNTY . W.O. 5110 (PARCEL 21).

On June 9, 1964, four bids were received in response to a published Notice of Intention of the State Lands Commission to enter into a lease for the extraction of oil and gas from 5,553 acres more or less of tide and submerged lands designated as W.O. 5110, Parcel 21, Santa Barbara County. This offer was authorized by the Commission on April 29, 1964 (Calendar Item page 49).

All bids submitted were reviewed by the staff as to technical sufficiency and economic factors. The office of the Attorney General reviewed the highest bid, submitted by Richfield Oil Corporation and Standard Oil Company of California, and determined:

- A. That the Commission has complied with the procedural requirements of law:
- B. That the bid submitted conforms with:
  - 1. The bid requirements as specified in the proposal of the Commission;
  - 2. Applicable provisions of law; and
  - 3. The rules and regulations of the Commission.

A summary tabulation of the bonus-payment offers received pursuant to the lease proposal is attached (Exhibit "A").
