3 GENERAL PERMIT, RECREATIONAL USE: AUTHORIZATION FOR SWITTIEMENT AND DISMISSAL OF SUIT; STANLEY J. AND RUTH L. GÀ E - W 503.808.

During consideration of Calendars 37 and 38, attached Mr. Robert C. Hight, Chief Counsel, explained the items were identical and stated that they involved two people on the river who did not have a permit for a recreational pier.
He also made changes to the Resolution deleting the word "NONPREJUDICIAL" in paragraph #4.

Upon motion duly made and darried, Calendars 37 and 38 were approved without objection by a vote of 2-0, amended as Follows

- AUTHORIZES THE ISSUANCE TO STANLEY J. AND RUTH L. GALE OF A 10-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT-RECREATIONAL USE FROM MARCH 1, 1977; IN CONSIDERATION OF ANNUAL RENTAL IN THE AMOUNT OF \$40; FOR THE USE OF TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS IN THE SACRAMENTO RIVER, SACRAMENTO COUNTY: FOR DOCK FACILITIES ON THE LAND DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED HERETO AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF,
- AUTHORIZES THE STAFF TO SETTLE THE LITTIGATION AND EXECUTE A DISMISSAL OF PEOPLE V. GALE, SACRAMENTO COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT NO. 25672, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE EXECUTION OF THE ABOVE PERMIT.

GENERAL PERMIT RECREATIONAL USE AUTHORIZATION FOR SETTLEMENT AND DISMISSAL OF SUIT STANLEY J. AND RUTH L. GALE

On June 1, 1976 the State Lands Division staff filed suit against Stanley J. and Ruth L. Gale. The suit sought ejectment and damages for the unlawful use of State property loccated the Sagramento River, Sacramento County, approximately 3 miles north of Sagramento.

Subsequently, after some protracted pretrial litigation, the defendants agreed, in settlement, to a permit for the future use of State lands. This permit arrangement would eliminate a long standing dispute between the State and the Gales.

APPLICANT:

Stanley J. and Ruth L. Gale 1963 Garden Highway Sacramento, California

LAND USE:

Existing dock

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:

Initial period: 10 years from March 1, 1977.

5 year rent review, with limitations of increase to no more than 50% of existing rental and condition that if legislation is enacted reducing or eliminating rental obligation, that such would be effective in permit arrangement.

Liability insurance: \$100,000 for bodily injury; \$10,000 for property damage or \$100,000 single liability or valid home, owner's policy.

RENEWAL OPTION: None

SURETY BOND: None

CONSIDERATION: \$40 per annum.
