Installation, operation and maintenance of one LAND USE: eight inch pipeline for transportation of refined petroleum products. TERMS OF ORIGINAL LEASE: 20 years beginning January 1, Initial period: 1978. Two successive periods of Renewal options: ten years each. Public liability insurance: \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and \$2,000,000 for property damage. \$15,000 per annum; ten-year Consideration: rent review. TERMS OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT: This amendment modifies Lease PRC 5439 to provide for one additional crossing of State land totalling approximately 0.064-acres.

BASIS FOR CONSIDERATION: Pursuant to 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2003.

**WHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:** 

- Lessee contacted staff on February 24, 1986 1. asking for permission to install a pipeline under the Bear River. The pipeline had previously been located on a Southern Pacific Railroad crossing, a portion of which collapsed during the recent storms and resulting floods in Northern California. The California Department of Transportation gave Lessee permission to temporarily place the pipeline on the highway crossing of the Bear River. Lessee now wishes to remove the exposed pipeline from the highway and install it under the riverbed as scon as possible. This pipeline system starts in the San Francisco Bay area and serves various distribution points in Northern California and Nevada. This particular portion is the only pipeline source of refined petroleum products to the Northern Sacramento Valley area.
  - Governor Deukmejian has proclaimed a state of emergency in Placer County pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act as of February 20, 1986.

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## CALENDAR ITEM NO. (CONT'D)

- On January 26, 1978, by Calendar Item 3. No. 25, the State Lands Commission approved Master Lease PRC 5439, whereby 19 SPPL petroleum pipeline leases were consolidated into one lease to streamline them into a systemwide approach. Rental was determined using the proration procedure contained in the Commission's general leasing regulations in 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2007. Changes, alterations or amendments to the lease can be made by mutual agreement of the parties. The proposed amendment adds only 0.064 acres to the master lease and would only effect a minimal change in rental. Staff recommends maintaining the current annual rent until the next rent review which is due January 1, 1983.
- Purspant to the Commission's delegation of 4. authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14/ Cal. Adm. Code 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a statutory exempt project. The project is exempt because it involves a project undertaken, carried out, or approved by a public agency to maintain, repair, restore, demolish, or meplace property or facilities wed as a result of a damaged or de Jaster-stricken area in disaster in which a stat if emergency has been proclaimed by the Governor pursuant to Chapter 7 (commancing with Section 8550) of Division 1, Title 2 of the Government Code.

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 This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. but will not affect those Gignificant lands.

OF ADDENDUM NO. 2 OF LEASE PRC 5439, EFFECTIVE MARCH 1, 1986, SUBSTANTIALLY IN THE FORM ON FILE IN THE PRINCIPAL OFFICE OF THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION COVERING THE LAND DEPICTED ON EXHIBIT "A-2" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF. ALL REMAINING TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF LEASE PRC 5439 REMAIN UNCHANGED AND IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.


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
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
