## OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. The proposed project is the second phase development of a county regional park. The upland property was acquired by Yolo County in 1970. The improvements on the adjacent sovereign land will be used for water-related recreational purposes along the Sacramento River.
- 2. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorical exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 3, New Construction of Small Structures, 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2905(c)(1), and Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land, 14 Cal. Adm. Code 15304.

Authority: P.R.C. 21084, 14 Cal. Adm. Code 15300, and 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2905.

- 3. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$100.
- 4. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

# IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

- 1. FIND THAT THE ACTIVITY IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CEQA PURSUANT TO 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15061 AS A CATEGORICAL EXEMPT PROJECT, CLASS 3, NEW CONSTRUCTION OF SMALL STRUCTURES, 2 CAL. ADM. CODE 2905(c)(1), AND CLASS 4, MINOR ALTERATIONS TO LAND, 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15304.
- 2. FIND THAT THIS ACTIVITY IS CONSISTENT WITH THE USE CLASSIFICATION DESIGNATED FOR THE LAND PURSUANT TO P.R.C. 6370, ET SEQ.
- 3. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO THE COUNTY OF YOLO OF A 49-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT PUBLIC AGENCY USE BEGINNING MARCH 27, 1986; IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT, WITH THE STATE RESERVING THE RIGHT AT ANY TIME TO SET A MONETARY RENTAL IF THE COMMISSION FINDS SUCH ACTION TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST; FOR A RAMP, FLOATS, PILINGS AND A CONCRETE WALK, AND MINOR RIPRAP ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.

#### LAND DESCRIPTION

All that tide and sumberged land in the bed of the Sacramento River, Yolo County, California, lying immediately beneath floating docks, pilings, a boat ramp, riprap, and a concrete walkway, said structures being a portion of Yolo County's "Elkhorn Regional Park" and being located along the right bank of the Sacramento River at River Mile 69.5 approximately one mile downstream of the Interstate Highway 5 crossing of the Sacramento River, TOGETHER WITH a necessary use area extending 10 feet from the extremities of said floating docks.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM any portion lying landward of the ordinary high water mark of the Sacramento River.
