Approval of extension of a permit to prospect for gold, silver and other valuable minerals other than oil and gas, geothermal resources, sand and gravel, on approximately 604.62 acres of land, located in San Bernardino County.

TERMS OF EXTENSION:

September 1, 1986 through August 31, 1987.

AREA, TYPE OF LAND AND ECCATION:

Approximately 604.62 acres of State School Land described as Lots 1, 2, 3 and 4 in SE 1/4, SW 1/4, N 1/2, Section 16, T1S, R12E, SBM, San Bernardino County.

PREREQUISITE ITEMS:

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

Mineral Prospecting Permit PRC 6699 was approved for issuance to Fargo Resources, Inc. by the Commission on June 21, 1984, but did not become effective until September 1, 1984 due to bonding delays.

Fargo Resources, Inc. erected monuments at each corner of the permit and posted notices. Fargo Resources, Inc. originally contemplated that a public offering could be completed and that financing for this project as well as others would be available by approximately mid-1985. In fact, however, a combination of unfortunate market conditions for the type of Offering combined with a substantial backlog in the offices of the Superintendent of Brokers for the Vancouver Stock Exchange, resulted in substantial delays in completing the overall financing package. The public offering was completed in late April, 1986 and work began soon thereafter on the property in May of 1986. Although work is continuing to date on the property, the exploration program cannot feasibly be completed prior to the expiration of the current term of the Prospecting Permit on August 31, 1986. Accordingly, an extension of one year, through and including August 31, 1987, has been requested by the permittee.

Because of concern about the apparent relationship of the public offering to the prospecting permit staff initially recommended denial of the extension. However, as a result of further contacts with the applicant, it has been determined that the entire corporation went public. Funds were not solicited solely on the basis of the State permit. In fact, Fargo has holdings in British Columbia which are now being developed. The president of Fargo has advised us (verified through review of company's prospectus) that "at no time has Fargo used its current prospecting permit to selectively promote or raise public funds". Fargo also holds mineral patents for the section immediately south of the subject State

land. Some of these mineral patents also project into Section 16, although this area is not part of the State permit.

Staff can now recommend approval of the proposed extension.

The project is exempt under Class 6, Information Collection, 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2905(e).

- 2. Any change in the proposed prospecting activities will require an environmental review pursuant to CEQA Regulations.

Said right shall be subject to all necessary environmental approvals. The permits will not affect the discretion of the Commission in granting or denying such environmental approvals.




