ANNEXATION OF TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS, CITY OF CORONADO, SAN DIEGO COUNTY

The State Lands Commission has received a request from the San Diego County Local Agency Formation Commission to review and approve the boundaries and annexation of the proposed North Island Reorganization (No. RO-86-23) involving deannexation of certain lands within the boundaries of the City of San Diego and annexation of those lands along with certain unincorporated lands of San Diego County into the City of Coronado. This area includes approximately 5,945 acres, more or less, of land including a portion of the present and historic tide and submerged lands in the Bay of San Diego and the Pacific Ocean. The area proposed for annexation is located primarily westerly as well as northerly and southerly of previously annexed areas and involves generally the North island area (including the Spanish Bight) and surrounding tide and submerged lands (see Exhibit "B").

Pursuant to Government Code Section 56108(c) and (d), the Commission is to review and approve or deny the proposed annexation boundaries as appropriate and correct within 45 days.

The transfer of police power will not effect the status of property ownership of any of the lands involved including tide and submerged lands granted by the legislature to other governmental agencies. The staff of the Commission has reviewed the proposed annexation boundary descripcion and finds it adequate. The map submitted in conjunction with the proposed annexation contains certain information with which the staff does not agree — but which is not germain to this annexation. The proposed Commission findings do not approve the map, only the annexation description. Furthermore, starf has no objection to transfer of local police power jurisdiction from the City of San Diego and the County of San Diego to the City of Coronado pursuant to 56108(a) and, therefore, submits the recommendations of approval below.

- 4. AUTHORIZE STAFF COUNSEL TO GIVE THE REQUISITE NOTICE OF SAID APPROVALS TO THE CITY OF CORONADO AND TO THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF SAN DIEGO COUNTY LAFCO PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 56108(e).

A portion of the Peninsula of San Diego known as North Island in the Harbor of San Diego, California and more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the Mean High Tide Line of the Pacific Ocean at a concrete monument marked CClll as shown on Miscellaneous Map No. 199, filed in the Office of the Recorder of San Diego County, California, also shown as trayerse Station 108 on Miscellaneous Map No. 121, filed in the Office of the Recorder of said San Diego County, said point also being the most westerly corner of Coronado Estates Map No. 3517 as filed in the Office of the Recorder of said San Diego County, thence N75034'13"W 294.12 feet to Station 109; thence N72009'13"W 335.72 feet to Station 110; said stations 108, 109, and 110 being shown on Miscellaneous Map No. 199 and also Miscellaneous Map No. 121; thence along the Westerly City Boundary of Coronado. as described in California Statutes 1923, Chapter 49 and Statutes 1931, Chapter 293, NOOCOO'16"E 310 feet, more of less, to the shoreline of the former Spanish Bight between Coronado Beach, South Island and Coronado Beach, North Island as described in de-annexation proceedings confirmed by the Board of Delegates of San Diego on 13 October 1890; thence westerly, northerly and easterly along the North Island shoreline of the former Spanish Bight to the westerly terminus of the adjudicated boundary between the City of San Diego and the City of Coronado, Superior Court Case No. 238964, 22 July 1960 as amended 8 August 1986; thence S70°15'E (Record S69°44'10"E) 517 feet, more or less, to station 541 on the combined pierhead and bulkhead line of San Diego Bay as shown on U.S. Army Engineer District, Los Angeles, California, April 1969 drawing File No. 426, entitled Harbor Lines of San Diego Bay, California; thence continuing along the adjudicated boundary S70015'E 2834.06 feet to a point on the combined pierhead and bulkhead line; thence N19045'00"E 300 feet; thence around North Island along a line parallel to and 300 feet to the bay side of the combined pierhead and bulkhead line, shown on said U.S. Army Engineer District drawing File No. 426 and the similarly titled U.S. Army Engineer District drawing of June 1965, File No. 425.1, described as follows: Commencing at Station 539 on the combined pierhead and bulkhead line; thence N70015'00"W 4250.00 feet to Station 541; thence N23^o49'06"E 1950.20 feet to Station 543; thence N50002'55"W 1379.40 feet to Station 545; thence N63009'43"W 1164.80 feet to Station 547; thence N87⁰07'14"W 857.10 feet to Station 549; thence N90000'00"W 2243.50 feet to Station 551; thence
