- 1. The applicant conducts a large scale fish breeding operation. The proposed expansion of facilities on the upland includes twenty 30' x 85' diameter concrete tanks, fish food storage building, and a fish release and recapture station. To accommodate the above, the applicant proposes to add four new 24-inch diameter water intake lines within his existing State lands lease arek.
- 2. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

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

PROJECT LOCATION


The project is located in the coastal zone of northern Santa Cruz County, approximately 12 miles north of the City of Santa Cruz. The site is bounded by Davenport Landing Road to the north, Highway 1 to the east, Davenport Landing beach fronting the Pacific Ocean to the west, and open farmlands on a coastal terrace elevated above the site to the south (see Figures 1 and 2).

PROJECT DESCRIPTION


Proposed expansion of existing facilities. The project will involve: 1) grading and filling of approximately two-thirds of the site; 2) Build seven large, four medium, and six small fish tanks into the ground; 3) a small (660+ square feet) addition to the existing building; 4) realignment of the driveway; and 5) installation of seawater intake lines and pumps. Five 24-inch seawater intake lines will be buried under the beach, and will extend from the building to the ocean. Four will be placed in the existing conduit and one cemented in place next to the conduit.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS

No significant environmental impacts were identified within the part of the project that the Commission will be considering for approval.



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
