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## REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF AWARD OF CRUDE OIL SALES CONTRACTS BY CITY OF LONG BEACH, LONG BEACH HARBOR DEPARTMENT TIDELANDS PARCEL AND PARCEL "A", WILMINGTON OIL FIELD

On October 21, 1987, the State Lands Commission approved the specifications and forms submitted by the City of Long Beach for the sale of crude oil produced from and allocated to the Long Beach Harbor Department Tidelands Parcel and Parcel "A", Wilmington Oil Field, Los Angeles County.

The Long Beach Harbor Department Tidelands Parcel oil was offered for sale in two separate contracts: an 8% segment which consists of approximately 600 BPD of oil and a 4-1/2%segment which consists of approximately 340 BPD of oil, both of which are 170 API gravity oil. The Parcel "A" oil was offered for sale in another separate contract as a 12-1/2% segment which consists of approximately 200 BPD of oil of 190 API gravity oil.

A Notice Inviting Bids was published in the <u>Wall Street Journal</u> (Western Edition) and <u>The Oil Daily</u> on October 27, 28 and 29, 1987. All three contracts were competitively bid with the bid factor being a bonus per barrel above the Base Price. The Base Price is defined as the highest price posted for like crude oil on the day of delivery in the Wilmington, Long Beach (Sig -1 Hill), Huntington Beach and Inglewood Oil Fields among & postings of Chevron USA, Inc., Mobil Oil Corporation and Oil Company of California. Bids were received and opened . ່າກ November 12, 1987. The results of the bidding are shown in

Fiscal and legal reviews of the submitted bid material were done by the Long Beach City Auditor's office and the City Attorney's office as well as by the SEC Auditing and Legal Based on the results of these reviews, the highest responsible bidder for each contract is identified on Exhibit "A".

The contracts, if awarded, will be for a term of eight months beginning on June 1, 1988 and ending on February 1, 1989.

Staff recommends the awarding of the contracts to the highest responsible bidders identified on Exhibit "A" for the period beginning on June 1, 1988 until February 1, 1989.
