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APPROVAL OF A NON-EXCLUSIVE GEOLOGICAL SURVEY PERMIT
ON TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF
THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION

PROPOSED AUTHORIZATION:

Approval of a Non-Exclusive Geological Permit
for three years to conduct geological surveys
on tide and submerged lands under the ownership
jurisdiction of the State Lands Commission out
to the three-mile limit, within permit regions
I, II, III and IV as depicted on Exhibit "B"
hereto.

TERMS: The term of the Non-Exclusive Geological Survey
Permit is three years.

PREREQUISITE ITEMS:

Required statutory filing fee, expense deposit,
and performance bond.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. The geological surveys authorized under the terms of the permit are for the purpose of obtaining shallow samples of the seafloor for geotechnical information. The data obtained is used in the design of offshore structure (pipelines, marine terminals, platforms, public improvements such as sewer outfalls, marinas, etc.) and in the technical and environmental analyses of existing and proposed offshore oil and gas operations.

The shallow samples are obtained using nonrotary techniques (dart, jet, percussion, grab) from a self-contained vessel. The vessel is typically 50 to 150 feet in length with a six-foot draft.

2. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. Section 6370, et. seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the permit, as part of the program for the project as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
3. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority, CEQA (P.R.C. Section 21084), and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. Sections 15061 and 15306), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorical exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 6, Information Collection, 2 Cal. Code Regs. Section 2905(e)(3).

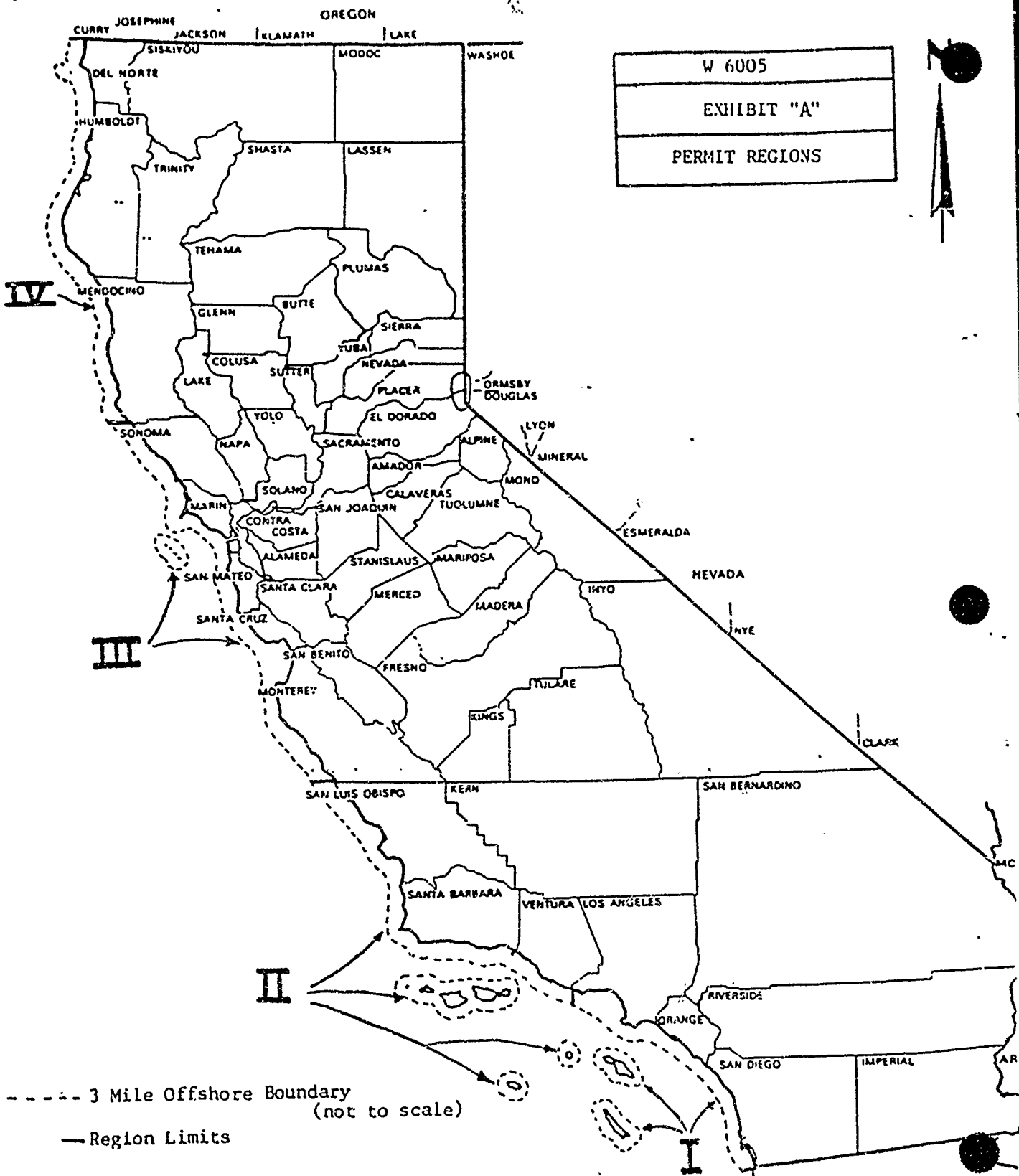

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. FIND THAT THE ACTIVITY IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CEQA PURSUANT TO P.R.C. SECTION 21084 AND 14 CAL. CODE REGS. SECTIONS 15061 AND 15306 AS A CATEGORICAL EXEMPT PROJECT, CLASS 6, INFORMATION COLLECTION, 2 CAL. CODE REGS. SECTION 2905(e)(3).
2. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO SACHSE ENGINEERING ASSOCIATES, INC. NON-EXCLUSIVE GENERAL PERMIT TO CONDUCT GEOLOGICAL SURVEYS FOR THE PERIOD APRIL 1, 1989 THROUGH MARCH 31, 1992 WITHIN PERMIT REGIONS I, II, III AND IV AS DEFINED ON EXHIBIT "B" HERETO.
