Code Regs. 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 1, Existing Facilities, 14 Cal. Code Regs. 15301(i).

- 2. Under the permit issued by Minute Item No. 3 on February 2, 1982, The Department of Fish and Game was issued and eight- (8) year permit for rehabilitating selected salmon spawning areas in the Klamath River Drainage System. The permit included any State interest in the Klamath and Shasta rivers for the support of anadromous fishery. This permit will allow the continuation of the rehabilitation program.
- This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. but will not affect those significant lands.
- The annual rental value of the sites combined is estimated to be \$90.
- 5. The Applicant has requested the processing fee be waived due to the fact that this continuing project benefits the public by increasing salmon population in the Klamath River System.




