Removal of sunken and abandoned vessels.

action to be in the State's best interest.

Filing fee and processing costs waived in consideration for the public benefit to be derived from this project.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 4. Minor Attention to Land, 2 Cal. Code Regs 2905(d) (3).

Authority: P.R.C. 21084, 14 Cal. Code Regs. 15300, and 2 Cal. Code Regs. 2905.

A local contractor in Morro Bay, Associated Pacific, has approached the Department of Fish and Game (DFG) with an offer to remove sunken abandoned vessels from the Morro Bay estuary. These vessels pose a hazard not only to navigation, but are a source of pollution to the waters of the bay and, consequently, to the oysters within adjacent mariculture leases administered by The proposed sunken vessel removal will be conducted by barge and marine crane without charge to the State. The abandoned vessels will be transferred to land within the city limits of the City of Morro Bay. From there, the debris will be transferred to city dump trucks for landside storage and disposal. To the greatest extent feasible, recyclable materials will be salvaged. The project is proposed to occur in the latter part of June 1990. This activity will be coordinated with a clean-up program of human-introduced debris within the bay at the T-piers within the grant to the City of Morro Bay.

The planned clean-up project has received the support of the City of Morro Bay, the local administrator of the California Conservation Corps, the Friends of the Estuary, divers from local dive shops in the county, and the Cal Poly State University Dive Club.

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- 3. Pursuant to Habors and Navigation Code
 Section 522, DFG has documented the
 abandonment of the sunken vessels to be
 removed. Based upon a listing prepared by
 the Department of Fish and Game, staff has
 contacted the owners of the abandoned,
 sunken vessels. The owners of record have
 no objection to the removal of their
 vessels. Also staff has determined that
 the vessels have no historic or other
 unique value based upon oral testimony of
 the owners of record.
- 4. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

FIND THAT THE SUNKEN ABANDONED VESSELS LOCATED WITHIN MORRO BAY POSE A HEALTH AND SAFETY HAZARD TO THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AS WELL AS HAZARD TO NAVIGATION AND THAT THE REMOVAL OF THE ABANDONED VESSELS FROM THE WATERS OF MORRO BAY IS IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE STATE.
- 3. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO THE CALIFORNIA STATE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME OF A ONE-YEAR PUBLIC AGENCY PERMIT BEGINNING JUNE 13, 1990; IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY WITH THE STATE RESERVING THE RIGHT AT ANY TIME TO SET A MONETARY RENTAL IF THE COMMISSION FINDS SUCH ACTION TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST; FOR HAZARD REMOVAL ON THE LAND SHOWN ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.



