DREDGING PERMIT

APPLICANT:

San Diego Unified Port District P. O. Box 488 San Diego, California 92101

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION: Granted, mineral reservation lands in south San Diego Bay, San Diego County.

LAND USE: Remove a maximum 11,600 cubic yards of material to create new intertidal habitat within San Diego Bay as mitigation required by the United States Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) to compensate for loss of similar habitat due to past construction.

> The material will be disposed of at an approved upland site in Chula Vista where it will be used for public benefit purposes as fill material in the public park portion of the Woodcrest Terra Nova project.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT: Initial period:

One year beginning June 11, 1990.

Royalty:

No charge for material disposed at the approved upland disposal to be used for public benefit purposes.

\$0.25 per cubic yard for any material used for private benefit or sold.

- The United States Army Corps of Engineers is requiring the creation of 1.0 acre of new intertidal habitat to mitigate for loss of similar habitat due to construction of a protective groin at La Playa Beach and construction of shoreline revetment at "G" Street Mall.
- The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service has recommended upland disposal of the excavated material so that the remainder of the adjacent project area will still be available for possible future wetlands restoration projects.
- 3. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 4, Minor Alteration to Land, 14 Cal. Code Regs.15304.



THE MATERIAL WILL BE DISPOSED OF AT AN APPROVED UPLAND SITE IN CHULA VISTA WHERE IT WILL BE USED FOR PUBLIC BENEFIT PURPOSES AS FILL MATERIAL IN THE PUBLIC PARK PORTION OF THE WOODCREST TERRA NOVA PROJECT. NO ROYALTY SHALL BE CHARGED FOR MATERIAL DISPOSED OF AT THE APPROVED UPLAND SITE TO BE USED FOR PUBLIC BENEFIT PURPOSES. A ROYALTY OF \$0.25 PER CUBIC YARD SHALL BE CHARGED FOR ANY MATERIAL USED FOR PRIVATE BENEFIT OR SOLD. SUCH PERMITTED ACTIVITY IS CONTINGENT UPON APPLICANT'S COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PERMITS, RECOMMENDATIONS, OR LIMITATIONS ISSUED BY FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.
