MAINTENANCE DREDGING PERMIT

APPLICANT: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
Attn: Mo Chang
300 N. Los Angeles Street
Los Angeles, California 90012

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:
State-owned tide and submerged lands waterward
of the 1939 mean high tide line in Port Hueneme
Harbor Entrance Channel, Ventura County.

PROPOSED LAND USE:
Dredge a maximum 220 cubic yards of material to
maintain a navigable depth for military,
commercial and recreational craft using Port
Hueneme Harbor.

The dredged material will be used to replenish
Hueneme Beach.

TERM OF PROPOSED PERMIT:
Initial period: One year beginning September 1,
1990.

Royalty: No royalty shall be charged for
material used for public beach
replenishment for public
benefit.

\$0.25 per cubic yard for
material used for private
benefit or sold.

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PREREQUISITE CONDITIONS, FEES AND EXPENSES:
Filing fee has been received.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:
1. A Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI),
was prepared and adopted for this project
by the United States Army, Corps of
Engineers. The document was circulated for
public review as required by state and
local laws, and notice was given meeting
the standards in 14 Cal. Code Regs.
15072(a). Therefore, pursuant to 14 Cal.
Code Regs. 15225, the staff recommends the
use of the Federal FONSI in place of a
Negative Declaration.

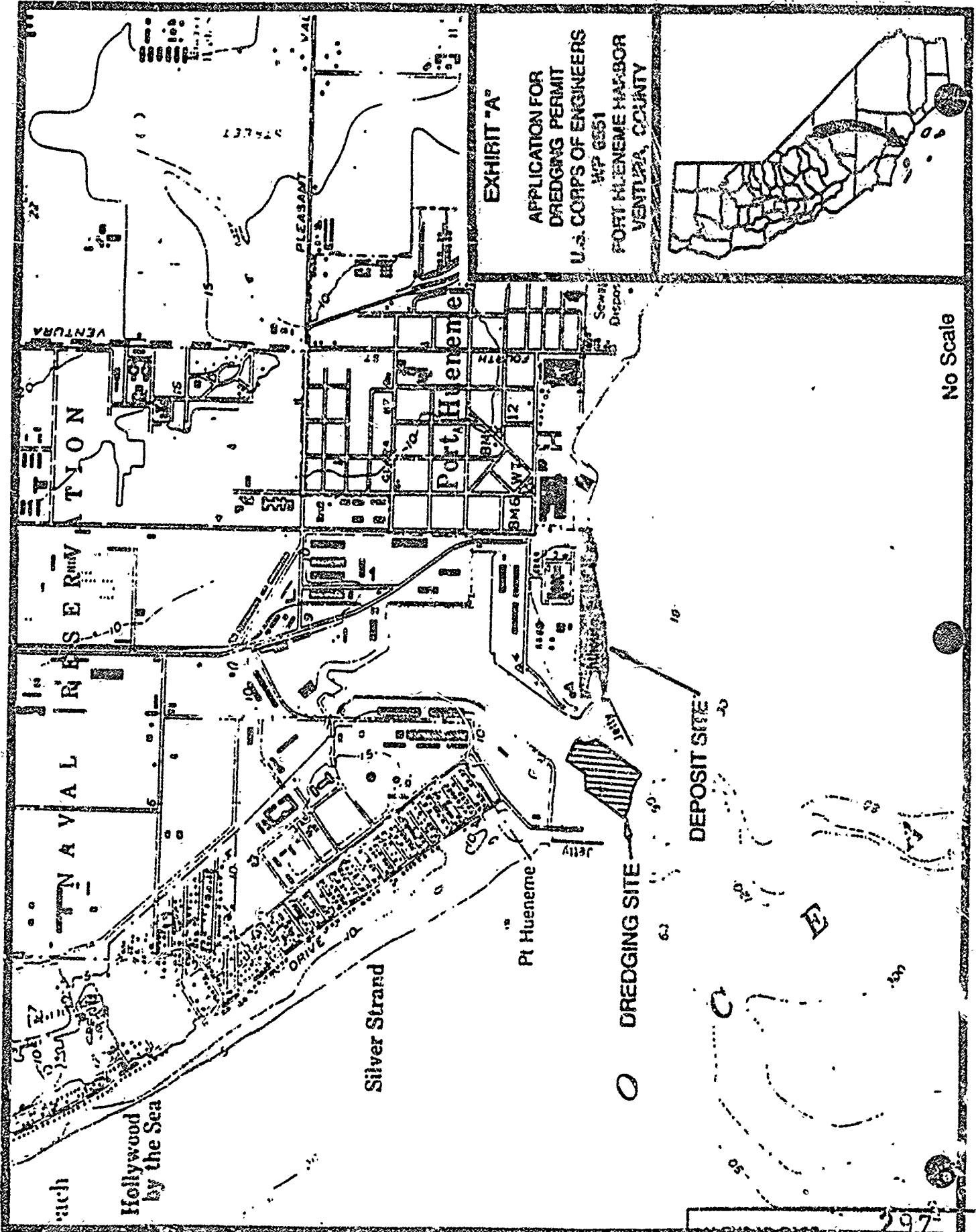
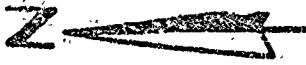
IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. DETERMINE THAT THE FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT (FONSI) PREPARED AND ADOPTED FOR THIS PROJECT BY THE UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CEQA AND THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO 14 CAL. CODE REGS. 15225, ADOPT SUCH FEDERAL DOCUMENT FOR USE IN PLACE OF A NEGATIVE DECLARATION.
2. DETERMINE THAT THE PROJECT, AS APPROVED, WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT.
3. AUTHORIZE STAFF TO ISSUE TO THE U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS THE DREDGING PERMIT ON FILE IN THE OFFICE OF THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION. THE PERMIT SHALL AUTHORIZE DREDGING A MAXIMUM 220 CUBIC YARDS OF MATERIAL FROM THE ENTRANCE TO PORT HUENEME HARBOR AND DISPOSAL AT HUENEME BEACH FOR ONE YEAR BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 1, 1990. NO ROYALTY

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SHALL BE CHARGED FOR MATERIAL USED FOR PUBLIC BEACH REPLENISHMENT. \$0 25 PER CUBIC YARD SHALL BE CHARGED FOR MATERIAL USED FOR PRIVATE BENEFIT OR SOLD THE PERMITTED ACTIVITY IS CONTINGENT UPON APPLICANT'S COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PERMITS, RECOMMENDATIONS OR LIMITATION ISSUED BY FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.

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
