APPROVE AWARD OF CRUDE OIL SALES CONTRACT
BY CITY OF LONG BEACH FOR CITY'S SHARE OF CRUDE OIL
PRODUCED FROM CERTAIN TRACTS WITHIN
THE FAULT BLOCK IV UNIT AND FAULT BLOCK V RANGER ZONE UNIT
WILMINGTON OIL FIELD, LOS ANGELES COUNTY

BACKGROUND:

On August 12, 1991, the State Lands Commission approved the significant specifications for and authorized the sale of crude oil by the City of Long Beach (City) from tracts within the Fault Block IV Unit and Fault Block V Ranger Zone Unit, Wilmington Oil Field, Los Angeles County (see Exhibit "A").

At the present time, Ultramar, Inc. is purchasing the City's share of oil from these tracts under a crude oil sales contract which began November 1, 1990 and is scheduled to expire February 1, 1992. Ultramar is paying the City a bonus of \$0.3255 per barrel above a Base Price defined as the arithmetic average of prices posted for oil of like gravity and quality on the day of delivery in the Wilmington, Long Beach (Signal Hill), Huntington Beach, and Inglewood Oil Fields by Chevron U.S.A., Inc., Mobil Oil Corporation, Union Oil Company of California, and Texaco Trading & Transportation, Inc. The City's share of production from these tracts is approximately 600 barrels per day of 19° API gravity crude oil.

A Notice Inviting Bids was published in the Wall Street Journal (Western Edition) on September 17, 1991 and in The Oil Daily on September 17, 18, 1991. Bids were received and opened on October 9, 1991. Exhibit "A" contains the results of the bidding.

CALENDAR ITEM NO. C 18 (CONT'D)

Both the City of Long Beach and State Lands Commission Auditing and Legal staffs, respectively, have conducted fiscal and legal reviews of the submitted bid material. The highest responsible bidder, as indicated by these reviews, is identified in Exhibit "A". The Long Beach City Council will approve the award of the contract on November 26, 1991.

Staff recommends the award of the crude oil sales contract for tracts within the Fault Block IV Unit and Fault Block V Ranger Zone Unit, Wilmington Oil Field, Los Angeles County, for the period February 1, 1992 until February 1, 1993 to the highest responsible bidder identified in Exhibit "A".
