AMENDMENT OF PUBLIC AGENCY LEASE PRC 2881

LESSEE:

Ventura Port District
Richard Parsons, General Manager

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

A 138±-acre parcel of tide and submerged land located in the Pacific Ocean offshore of the City of San Buenaventura, Ventura County.

LAND USE:

Construction of a rock groin near the beach, an extension to an existing jetty and detached breakwater, and to provide for dredging of the entrance channel to the Ventura Harbor.

TERMS OF ORIGINAL PERMIT:

Initial period:
Forty-nine (49) years beginning May 11, 1962.

CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit; with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rental if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. The United States Army Corps of Engineers, on behalf of the Ventura Port District, proposes to make major modifications to the entrance channel to the Ventura Harbor. The project calls for the construction of a beach groin on the down coast side of the entrance channel and the addition to the existing north jetty and the detached breakwater of extensions to control sand flow into the entrance channel. The project will also provide for the dredging of the entrance channel to a depth of minus 40 feet and the dredging of a sand trap area. Sand removed as part of this project will be dispersed of offshore of public beaches to assure continued supply of sand down coast of the harbor entrance.
2. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$ 410,000.
3. A Negative Declaration/Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI), SCH No. 89040702, was prepared and adopted for this project by the Ventura Port District. The State Lands Commission's staff has reviewed such document.
4. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's

consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

5. A mitigation Monitoring Program (Program) for the United States Army Corps of Engineers/Ventura Port District Ventura Harbor Improvement Project has been prepared and is attached as Exhibit "D". The State Lands Commission will not have any responsibilities or obligations to fulfill under the terms of the Program.

Staff, however, has contacted each of the agencies identified within the Monitoring Program as responsible for monitoring specific measures which have been incorporated into the project. Staff have requested copies of all follow-up reports from each responsible agency to establish evidence of construction compliance with the identified project modifications which may have a direct or indirect effect upon lands administered by the State Lands Commission.

2. FIND THAT THIS ACTIVITY IS CONSISTENT WITH THE USE CLASSIFICATION DESIGNATED FOR THE LAND PURSUANT TO P.R.C. 6370, ET SEQ.
3. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO THE VENTURA PORT DISTRICT OF AN AMENDMENT TO LEASE PRC 2881 PROVIDING FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE LAND DESCRIPTION CONTAINED IN THE LEASES WITH THE LAND DESCRIPTION ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A". AUTHORIZE THE CONSTRUCTION OF EXTENSIONS TO THE EXISTING NORTH JETTY AND THE BREAKWATER AND TO CONSTRUCT A NEW SOUTH BEACH GROIN, ALL TO BE LOCATED ON THE LAND DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED, AND AUTHORIZE DREDGING OF THE ENTRANCE CHANNEL TO A DEPTH OF 40 FEET AND DISPOSAL OF THE DREDGED MATERIALS OFFSHORE FOR BEACH REPLENISHMENT PURPOSES. ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE LEASES WILL REMAIN UNCHANGED AND IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

LAND DESCRIPTION

A parcel of tide and submerged land in the Santa Barbara Channel adjacent to the Ventura Marina, Ventura County, California, more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the westerly line of Parcel 1 shown as Line 1, on a map filed in Book 17, Page 4 of Parcel Maps in the office of County Recorder of said County, having a bearing and distance of N 10° 41' 30" W, 4132.22 feet. Said point of beginning being N 10° 41' 30" W, 412.23 feet from the most southerly terminus of said westerly line; thence N 10° 41' 30" W, 3587.74 feet; thence S 79° 18' 30" W, 1905.31; thence S 10° 41' 30" E, 2190.34 feet; thence S 50° 25' 27" E, 1817.07 feet to a point on a line that bears S 79° 18' 30" W from the point of beginning; thence along said line N 79° 18' 30" E, 743.83 feet to the point of beginning.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM any portion lying landward of the mean high tide line of the Pacific Ocean.

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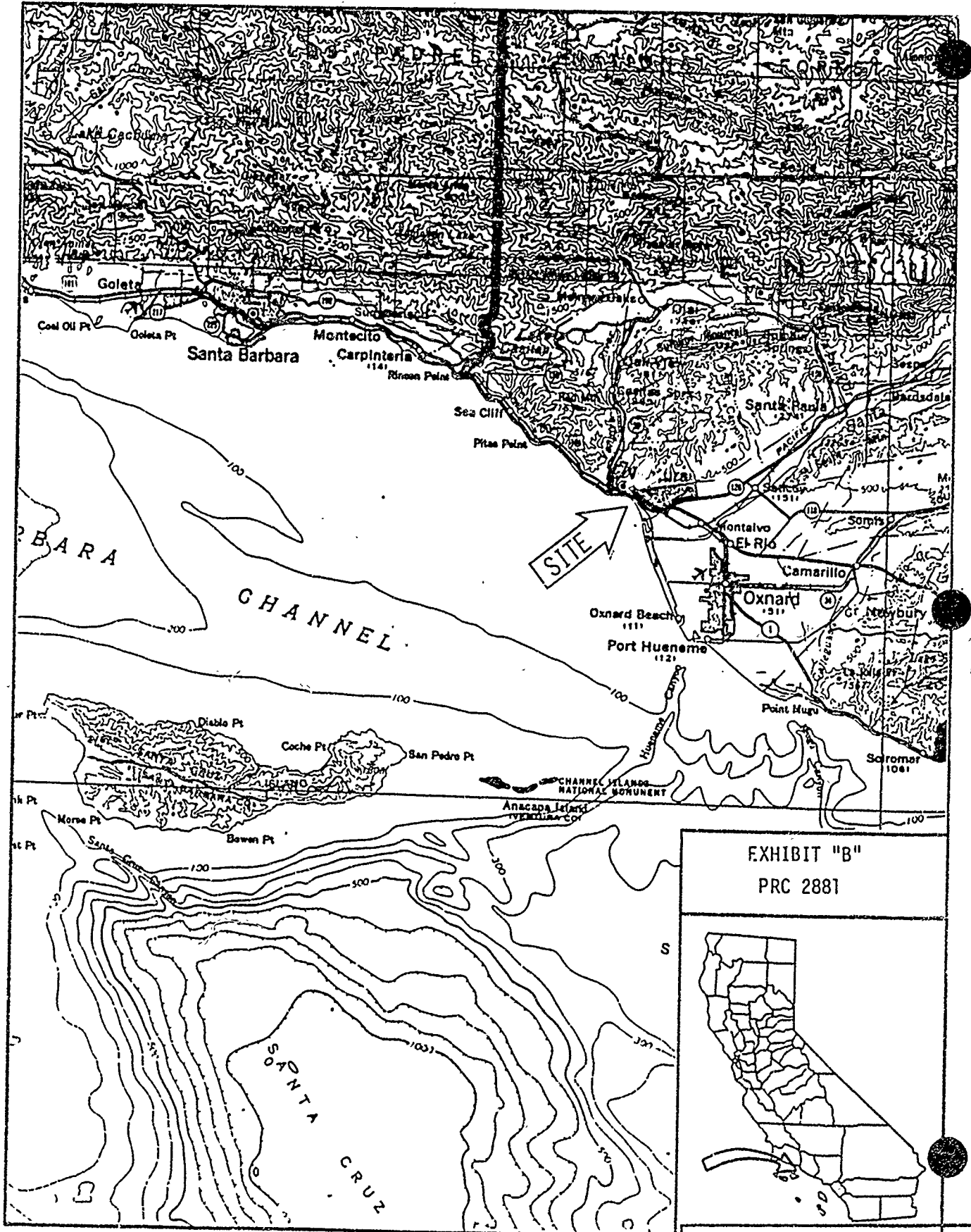

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MITIGATION MONITORING PROGRAM

This mitigation monitoring program for the Ventura Harbor Entrance Improvement project has been prepared in compliance with Assembly Bill 3180 (California Public Resources Code Section 21081.6) which became State Law on January 1, 1989. The program includes mitigation measures that have been incorporated into the project order to mitigate potentially significant effects on the environment.

Project mitigation measures, identified in the Ventura Harbor Navigation Improvements Final Report, revised March, 1990, to mitigate, avoid or substantially lessen significant effects on the environment will be incorporated into a checklist. Each mitigation measure will be listed separately on the checklist with appropriate spaces for monitoring the progress of implementation of the mitigation measure. This checklist is the basis for the monitoring program. Any information provided to the Port District by the Army Corps of Engineers for this development project must be kept with the checklist in the project file for the purpose of verification. A matrix showing each mitigation measure and details of monitoring is included at the end of this section.
