OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. A Negative Declaration, SCH 92061045, was prepared and adopted for this project by the City of Pismo Beach. The State Lands Commission's staff has reviewed such document.
- 2. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
- 3. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$100.
- 4. The City of Pismo Beach has applied to the Commission to construct a bluff-support structure and to retain an existing storm drain facility, located at Ocean Boulevard and Montecito Avenue, in the Shell Beach District of Pismo Beach. The bluff in this area has eroded to the point where Ocean Boulevard is undermined. The storm drain carries water flows to the Pacific Ocean.

The surrounding district is residential. The bluff is near vertical (3/4:1) to overhanging and approximately 26 feet in height. Recent erosion of the bluff has resulted in the undermining of Ocean Boulevard; asphalt and a segment of the curb broke away from the street and fell down the bluff during a series of storms. Temporary barriers have been erected to restrict access to this area and sackcrete (stacked bags of concrete) has been placed as an emergency measure. The bluff terminates in a rocky gravel-strewn beach. A shallow,
