GENERAL LEASE PUBLIC AGENCY USE

LESSEE:

California Department of Fish and Game (DFG) 1416 Ninth Street, 12th Floor Sacramento, California 95814

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign lands located within the Napa-Sonoma Marshes Wildlife Area, Napa and Solano Counties.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Management, operation and maintenance of sovereign lands in a manner consistent with the acquisition purposes of wetland enhancement and/or restoration, and protection and public use compatible with wetland habitat protection.

LEASE TERM:


Forty-nine years, beginning July 1, 1999

CONSIDERATION:

Public use and benefit; with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rent if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. At its March 8, 1994, meeting, the California State Lands Commission, as Trustee of the Kapiloff Land Bank Fund, authorized the expenditure of \$500,000 toward the joint purchase of 10,000 acres of land known as the Napa-Solano Wildlife Marshes Area as shown on Exhibit A. Other contributors were The Shell Oil Spill Litigation Settlement Trustee Committee, the California Wildlife Conservation Board and the California Coastal Conservancy. It was determined at that time that the parcel



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purchased by the State Lands Commission would later be leased to the California Department of Fish and Game. This agreement also includes all sovereign interests within the Napa-Sonoma Marshes Wildlife Area. The Department of Fish and Game is now requesting to take over management of the subject property.

2. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 13, acquisition of lands for wildlife conservation purposes; Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15313.

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21065 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15378.

3. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

AUTHORIZATION:

AUTHORIZE LEASE TO THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME OF A GENERAL LEASE - PUBLIC AGENCY USE, BEGINNING JULY 1, 1999, FOR A TERM OF FORTY NINE YEARS, THE LANDS SHOWN IN EXHIBIT A, FOR MANAGEMENT, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF SOVEREIGN LAND LOCATED WITHIN THE NAPASONOMA MARSHES WILDLIFE AREA, IN A MANNER CONSISTENT WITH THE ACQUISITION PURPOSES OF WETLAND ENHANCEMENT AND/OR RESTORATION, AND PROTECTION AND PUBLIC USE COMPATIBLE WITH WETLAND HABITAT PROTECTION FOR THE NAPA-SOLANO WILDLIFE MARSHES AREA. CONSIDERATION BEING THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT, WITH THE STATE RESERVING THE RIGHT AT ANY TIME TO SET A MONETARY RENT IF THE COMMISSION FINDS SUCH ACTION TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST.
