CONSIDER ACCEPTANCE OF THE PARTIAL QUITCLAIM OF OIL AND GAS LEASE NO. PRC 2793.1, (4,250 ACRES OF TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS) OFFSHORE SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2793.1 contains 4,250 acres of tide and submerged lands offshore Santa Barbara County, California.

BACKGROUND:

Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2793.1 (Lease) was issued to Richfield Oil Corporation, Socony Mobil Oil Company and Signal Oil and Gas Company on October 26, 1961, and contains 4,250 acres of tide and submerged lands offshore Santa Barbara County (leased lands). Through a series of corporate name changes, the current lessees are Atlantic Richfield Oil Company (ARCO), Exxon Mobil Corporation, and Phillips Petroleum Company (Phillips). Under the terms of the Lease, the lessee is required to pay an annual rental of \$1.00 per acre (\$4,250.14 for 4,250 acres) and commence drilling operations on the leased

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lands within three years. One well has been drilled on the leased lands, completed as a subsea well and subsequently abandoned in December 1997, as part of the SWARS project.

Public Resources Code section 6804.1 and Lease Paragraph 4 permit the lessee to make at any time a written quitclaim of all rights under the lease or of any portion of the leased lands comprising a ten-acre parcel or multiple thereof in a compact form. The quitclaim will be effective when it is filed with the State subject to the continued obligation of the lessee and its surety to pay all accrued rentals and royalties and to abandon all wells drilled on the leased lands.

Commission staff received two (Partial) Quitclaim Deeds for State Oil and Gas Lease" on the subject lease, one from ARCO dated June 15, 2000, and one from Phillips dated June 15, 2000. These documents quitclaim back to the State all of the lessee's right, title and interest in the leased lands described in Exhibit A of Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2793.1 dated October 26, 1961.

The receipt of a quitclaim deed from Exxon Mobil Corporation will complete quitclaim of the subject lease back to the State. However, in the interim, this lease will remain in effect with Exxon Mobil Corporation fully responsible for compliance with all of the terms and conditions of the lease.

A review of the Commission's files reveals that no default currently exists on the Lease, and that the Lessees have complied with all applicable laws and Lease provisions and has paid all rentals.

That area of tide and submerged lands bounded on the West by California Coordinate System, Zone 5, grid line having an X value of 1,310,420; on the East by a grid line having an X value of 1,320,570; on the landward (northerly) boundary by the ordinary high water mark of the Pacific Ocean; on the seaward (southerly) boundary by a line parallel to the ordinary high water mark and seaward therefrom three nautical miles; containing 4,250.14 acres.

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
