GENERAL LEASE - PUBLIC AGENCY USE

LESSEE:

Sonoma County Water Agency Post Office Box 11628 Santa Rosa, California 95406

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

11 acres, more or less, of sovereign lands in the Russian River, west of Jenner, Sonoma County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Continued periodic breaching of the sandbar at the mouth of the Russian River Estuary to create an outlet channel for flood control and habitat protection purposes.

LEASE TERM:

One year and thirty days, beginning January 1, 2003.

CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit; with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rental if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. On October 28, 1996, the Commission authorized a General Lease - Public Agency Use with the Sonoma County Water Agency. That lease expired on December 31, 2001. The Commission approved a new lease for continued breaching of the sandbar, but the new lease was only extended for one year because the Applicant's collateral permits expired at the end of 2002. Applicant intends to conduct additional breaching of the sandbar barrier at the mouth of the Russian River during the 2003 calendar year and has obtained collateral permits for this additional

breaching through the end of the proposed Lease Term. Applicant is permittee for the uplands adjoining the lease premises.

Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 1, Existing Facilities; Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15301(i).

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21084 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15300.

3. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.


