CONSIDER ACCEPTANCE OF THE FULL QUITCLAIM OF OIL AND GAS LEASE NO. PRC 2894.1, GAVIOTA AREA, SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

LESSEE:

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2894.1 contains 4,250 acres of tide and submerged lands in the vicinity of Gaviota, Santa Barbara County, California.

BACKGROUND:

Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2894.1 (Lease) contains the above described lands (leased lands) and was issued to Chevron and Shell by competitive bid on June 28, 1962. Shell Western E&P, Inc. assigned its fifty percent (50%) interest in PRC 2894 to Molino Energy Company on August 3, 1994. Chevron USA, Inc. assigned its fifty percent (50%) interest in PRC 2894.1 to Molino Energy Company on July 11, 1997. Molino Energy Company assigned forty percent (40%) of its interest to Benton Oil and Gas Company July 11, 1997. Molino Energy Company assigned the rest of its interest in PRC 2894.1 on April 24, 2001, to Harvest Natural Resources, Inc. (formerly Benton Oil and Gas Company). Under the terms of the Lease, the lessee is required to pay an annual rental of \$1.00 per acre (\$4,250.00). Two wells were drilled into the PRC 2894.1. Both wells were properly abandoned, and there are no outstanding obligations on this lease.

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CALENDAR ITEM NO. 46 (CONT'D)

On January 31, 2003, the Commission's Long Beach office received the document "(Full) Quitclaim Deed for State Oil and Gas Lease." This document was dated January 24, 2003, and quitclaims back to the State all of the lessee's right, title and interest in the leased lands described in Exhibit A, attached hereto, of Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2894.1, dated June 28, 1962.

A review of the Commission's files reveals that no default exists on the Lease, that the lessee has complied with all applicable laws and Lease provisions and has paid all applicable royalties and rentals.

The lease, one of three in the Gaviota area operated by Harvest Natural Resources, was a small part of the now terminated gas development. However, this lease was part of a larger oil and gas development project named "Manatee" by the original lessee, and was being considered for potential future development by the current lessee. Staff estimated that the total project could produce as much as 100 million barrels of oil, which, if developed, could have generated as much as \$366 million in royalty to the State. However, the potential for oil development was not sufficient to generate the outside investment needed for the lessee to undertake development. The "Manatee" reservoirs were spread out over all three leases. The other two leases are currently also being considered for quitclaim as soon as lease obligations are completed.



DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY
