RECREATIONAL PIER LEASE

APPLICANTS:

Jean P. Sagouspe and Diane E. Sagouspe

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign lands in Donner Lake, adjacent to 15861 Lakeside Landing, near Truckee, Nevada County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Continued use and maintenance of an existing pier as shown on the attached Exhibit A.

LEASE TERM:

Ten years, beginning June 8, 2007.

CONSIDERATION:

No monetary consideration pursuant to Public Resources Code section 6503.5.

SPECIFIC LEASE PROVISIONS:

Liability insurance in the amount of no less than \$500,000.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. Applicants own the uplands adjoining the lease premises.
- 2. On April 13, 1999, the Commission authorized a ten-year Recreational Pier Lease with Allen Ray Duemey and Suzanne Therese Duemey, as Trustees of the Duemey 1987 Family Trust dated April 27, 1992. That lease expired on November 29, 2008. On June 8, 2007, ownership of the upland property was deeded to Jean P. Sagouspe and Diane E. Sagouspe, who are now applying for a new Recreational Pier Lease.
- 3. Applicants qualify for a Recreational Pier Lease because they are natural persons who own the littoral land that is improved with a single-family dwelling.

4. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 1, Existing Facilities; Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 2905 (a)(2).

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21084 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15300 and Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 2905.

5. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
