GENERAL LEASE – RECREATIONAL USE

APPLICANT:

John F. Murray and Diane Lain Johnson Murray, trustees of the Murray Family Revocable Trust, under agreement dated May 27, 1988

PROPOSED LEASE:

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign land in Lake Tahoe, adjacent to 4750 North Lake Boulevard, Carnelian Bay, Placer County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Continued use and maintenance of one existing mooring buoy.

LEASE TERM:

10 years, beginning August 23, 2018.

CONSIDERATION:

\$377 per year, with an annual Consumer Price Index adjustment.

SPECIFIC LEASE PROVISIONS:

- 1. Liability insurance in an amount no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- 2. Lessee shall not store any personal items or construct any improvements in the Public Trust easement that may impair the public uses of access, navigation, fishing, and lake-related recreational uses.
- 3. If Lessee does not have a valid Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA) buoy permit, Lessee is required to obtain such authorization for the mooring buoy within 2 years after the certification of a Final Environmental Impact Statement for the Lake Tahoe Shorezone Ordinance Amendments and approval of the amended ordinances. If Lessee is unable to obtain such

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authorization within the time limit, they may be required to remove the buoy.

4. Lessee expressly acknowledges and agrees that issuance of a lease does not substitute for, or provide preference in, obtaining authorizations from TRPA or any other regulatory agency for the improvements authorized by the Commission.

STAFF ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATION:

Authority:

Public Resources Code sections 6005, 6216, 6301, 6501.1, 6503, and 6503.5; California Code of Regulations, title 2, sections 2000 and 2003.

Public Trust and State's Best Interests Analysis:

On May 5, 2008, the Commission authorized the issuance of Lease No. PRC 8017.9, a Recreational Pier Lease, for one existing mooring buoy, to John F. Murray and Diane Lain Johnson Murray, trustees of the Murray Family Revocable Trust, under agreement dated May 27, 1988, (<u>Item</u> <u>C06, May 5, 2008</u>). That lease expired on October 31, 2017. The Applicant is applying for a General Lease – Recreational Use for one existing mooring buoy.

The Applicant's buoy continued to occupy State land after the lease expired. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission accept compensation from the Applicant for the unauthorized occupation of State land in the amount of \$304 for the period beginning November 1, 2017, through August 22, 2018, the day before the proposed new lease becomes effective.

Applicant owns the upland adjoining the lease premises. The subject facility is privately owned and maintained. The mooring buoy is used for the docking and mooring of boats. Recreational boating is a water-dependent use that is generally consistent with the common law Public Trust Doctrine. The California Legislature has identified private recreational boating facilities as an authorized use of Public Trust land (Pub. Resources Code, § 6503.5).

The mooring buoy has existed for many years at this location. The buoy is located directly lakeward of the upland parcel and occupies a relatively small area of the lake.

The proposed lease does not alienate the State's fee simple interest or permanently impair public rights. The lease is limited to a 10-year term

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and does not grant the lessee exclusive rights to the lease premises and reserves an easement to the public for Public Trust-consistent uses. Upon termination of the lease, the lessee may be required to remove all improvements from State land and restore the lease premises to their original condition.

The proposed lease requires the lessee to insure the lease premises and indemnify the State for any liability incurred as a result of the lessee's activities thereon. The lease also requires the payment of annual rent to compensate the people of the State for the occupation of the public land involved.

For all the reasons above, staff believes the issuance of this lease will not substantially interfere with Public Trust needs at this location, at this time, and for the foreseeable term of the proposed lease, and is in the best interests of the State.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. These actions are consistent with Strategy 1.1 of the Commission's Strategic Plan to deliver the highest levels of public health and safety in the protection, preservation, and responsible economic use of the lands and resources under the Commission's jurisdiction.
- Staff recommends that the Commission find that issuance of the lease is exempt from the requirements of CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 1, Existing Facilities; California Code of Regulations, title 2, section 2905, subdivision (a)(2).

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21084 and California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15300 and California Code of Regulations, title 2, section 2905.

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RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It is recommended that the Commission:

CEQA FINDING:

Find that the issuance of the lease is exempt from the requirements of CEQA pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15061 as a categorically exempt project, Class 1, Existing Facilities; California Code of Regulations, title 2, section 2905, subdivision (a)(2).

PUBLIC TRUST AND STATE'S BEST INTERESTS:

Find that the proposed lease will not substantially impair the public rights to navigation and fishing or substantially interfere with Public Trust needs and values at this location, at this time, and for the foreseeable term of the lease; is consistent with the Public Trust Doctrine; and is in the best interests of the State.

AUTHORIZATION:

1. Authorize acceptance of compensation from the Applicant in the amount of \$304 for the unauthorized occupation of State land for the period beginning November 1, 2017, through August 22, 2018.

2. Authorize issuance of a General Lease – Recreational Use to the Applicant beginning August 23, 2018, for a term of 10 years, for the continued use and maintenance of one existing mooring buoy, as described in Exhibit A and shown on Exhibit B (for reference purposes only), attached and by this reference made a part hereof; annual rent in the amount of \$377 with an annual Consumer Price Index adjustment; and liability insurance in an amount no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

LAND DESCRIPTION

A parcel of submerged lands situated in the bed of Lake Tahoe, lying adjacent to fractional Section 22, Township 16 North, Range 17 East, M.D.B.&M., as shown on Official Government Township Plat approved November 10, 1865, County of Placer, State of California, more particularly described as follows:

A circular parcel of land, being 50 feet in diameter, underlying an existing buoy lying adjacent to that parcel described in Trust Transfer Deed recorded June 27, 1988 in Book 3425 at Page 661 in Official Records of said County.
