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NOTICE OF INTENT TO CONSIDER AN ADDENDUM TO A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION

An Addendum to a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) has been prepared by the California State Lands Commission (Commission), as a Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Pub. Resources Code, § 21000 et seq.), in response to an application submitted by Chevron Products Company (Chevron) to implement modifications to the Chevron Richmond Refinery Long Wharf (Long Wharf) to: improve its efficiency; comply with Marine Oil Terminal Engineering and Maintenance Standards (MOTEMS)¹ requirements; and enhance the safety of crews and operators.

On December 6, 2016, the Commission adopted the MND for the Chevron Long Wharf Maintenance Efficiency Project (Project), (State Clearinghouse (SCH) No. 2016082014 pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The Project, scheduled to commence in 2018, includes the following modifications to improve the reliability and efficiency of the Long Wharf, comply with Marine Oil Terminal Engineering and Maintenance Standards (MOTEMS) requirements, and enhance crew and operator safety.

The approved Project only authorized construction during non-holiday weekdays. Chevron is now seeking a minor project modification to authorize construction work to occur on some weekends and/or holidays as needed.

Project Title: Chevron Long Wharf Maintenance Efficiency Project

Project Location: 68.14 acres, more or less, of sovereign land in San Francisco Bay, adjacent to the Chevron Refinery in the city of Richmond, Contra Costa County, California

Project Description: Amend the Project to authorize construction work to occur on some weekends and/or holidays as needed.
